GOVERNMENT: Smithfield City has a six member council form of government with a mayor and city manager. The city manager is appointed by the mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council. The mayor is the Chief Executive Officer and Administrator. The city council reviews administration matters and has legislative responsibilities. Mayor and council serve four year terms. MEETINGS: City Council meetings are the second and fourth Wednesday of each month at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 69 North Main, Smithfield, Utah.

Planning Commission meetings are the third Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 69 North Main, Smithfield, Utah.

SMITHFIELD JUSTICE COURT: Court is held every Tuesday from 5:00 to 6:30, unless otherwise noted, in the City Council Chambers, located at 69 North Main. You may pay most court fines and tickets at the City Office. The court clerk's office is located at: 69 North Main, south side door by Police Station



TAXES: State of Utah has a 6.60% sales tax. A franchise tax of 5% is levied on cable-tv and telephone utilities. An energy Sales/Use tax of 6.00% is charged on electric and natural gas companies.

SCHOOLS: Cache County School District Office, 2063 N 1200 E, Logan, Utah 84321. There are two elementary schools in Smithfield, Sunrise Elementary (Grades K-2) and Summit Elementary (Grades 3-5). A third Elementary school (Grades K-5) is now being built at approximately 200 North 800 West in Smithfield. It will be giving a name when it closer to completion. Sky View High School (Grades 10-12) which accommodates the area north of Logan is also located in Smithfield at 250 East 600 South. The two middle schools are Cedar Ridge (grades 6-7) located in Hyde Park and White Pine (grades 6-7), located in Richmond. The North Cache Jr. High (grades 8-9) is also located in Richmond. Utah State University is situated just 7 miles south in Logan, Utah. Please contact the Cache School District for more information. 2063 North 1200 East, North Logan 752-3925

SEWER SERVICE: Sewer service is provided by Smithfield City at the charge of \$21.75 per month (In the late 1980's a sewer system was installed at a cost of \$5 million). Utility billing office is located at 69 North Main, open weekdays 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

NATURAL GAS AND ELECTRICITY: For natural gas service contact Questar Gas Company 1-800-323-5517. For electricity, call Rocky Mountain Power 1-888-221-7070.

SOLID WASTE COLLECTION: Smithfield City has solid waste pickup by Cache County Service Area. The sanitation landfill is located one mile west of Logan on 200 North. It is open Monday thru Saturday. Minimum dumping fee is \$10. Summer hours 7:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. - winter hours 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Call the Service Center, 716-9753 for information about garbage collection schedules, and call landfill at 750-9981 for landfill dumping fees, etc.

Individual Green Waste Bins are available for a fee of \$4.00 per month and will allow any lawn clipping, branches, or garden waste

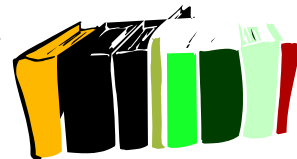
WATER: The city gets its water from a variety of wells and springs. According to water quality tests performed by the Utah State Health Department our water contains very little natural fluoride. Water meters are read in April, June, August and October. The charge for water is \$9.00 for the first 6,000 gallons used per month. Usage over the initial 6,000 gallons and up to and including 20,000 gallons is billed at \$.55 per 1,000 gallons. Anything over the 20,000 gallons is billed at \$.70 per 1,000. During months when meters are not read a minimum bill is assessed. Metered months are typically higher. The water meters belong to the City and are not to be turned on or off without approval of City Recorder or Work Coordinator. It is a Class B misdemeanor for anyone tampering with a water meter. A \$110.00 deposit is required to establish new service.

CITY HALL/LIBRARY: City hall is located at 96 South Main, beginning March 1, 2010. City administrative offices, utility billings, licensing, engineering, planning, building department, finance and accounting, data processing, information, mayor's office, and city court are located at that address. The City Library is located at 43 North Main and was built by the Andrew Carnegie Foundation. Library phone number is: 563-3555.

CITY SERVICE CENTER: Constructed in 1991 and located at 50 North 800 West, houses equipment and operations for the following departments: Water, streets, sewer, parks, cemetery and all other city public works. Call 435/563-6068.

FIRE DEPARTMENT, AMBULANCE AND PARAMEDICAL SERVICES: Located at 325 West 100 North, their door is open to groups or individuals who are interested in visiting Smithfield's volunteer fire department. Demonstrations can be scheduled for civic groups, clubs and church organizations on first aid, CPR, and fire safety. Boy Scout merit badge counselors are available at the station. CHURCHES: The dominant religion is the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

Other denominations represented in nearby Logan are Baptist, Catholic, Church of Christ, Presbyterian, Unitarian, Baha'i, Jehovah's Witness, and Episcopal.

TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS: Traffic tickets may be paid at the City Office, 69 North Main, 563-6226 or at the Justice Court every Tuesday Night from 5:00 to 6:30 p.m. (69 North Main).

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS: Parking on City streets is restricted during the night time from November 15, to March 15 each year for snow removal. The time restrictions are from 1:00 am to 6:00 am. Non-resident & visitor passes are available from the Smithfield Police Dept. which allows for limited winter parking by visitors.

ANIMAL LICENSES: Animal licenses are required for all dogs & cats over six months of age. Neutered male and spayed female dogs, \$10; dogs that have not been neutered or spayed, \$20. Neutered male & spayed female cats, \$5. Cats that have not been neutered or spayed, \$10. Current rabies vaccination required before license can be issued. Licenses expire December 31st of each year and must be renewed before the **last business day of December**. If they are not renewed by the last business day of December, there will be a late fee of \$20 for dogs, and \$10 for cats. A Kennel / Cattery permit is required for three or more dogs or cats.

Cattery permit (5 or more cats - spayed/neutered) - renewable every 3 years	\$15.00
Cattery permit (5 or more cats - not spayed/neutered) - renewable every 3 years	\$25.00
Combination dog/cat permit - spayed/neutered renewable every 3 years	\$25.00
Combination dog/cat permit - not spayed/neutered renewable every 3 years	\$50.00

POLICE DEPARTMENT: Smithfield City has it own Police Department. Officers are trained in specific areas including traffic control, investigation and detective bureau which involves burglary and theft, fraud and forgeries, sex crimes and deaths. Educational programs are available such as drug abuse, bicycle safety for schools, etc. Telephone: 563-8501, Dispatch: 716-9400; **Emergencies: 911.**

RECREATION, PARKS AND CEMETERY:

The Smithfield City Recreation Center is located at 315 East 600 South. It is open to the public on school days from 5:30 am to 9:00 am and from 5:00 pm to 10:00 pm. Some programs are also offered during school hours. On Saturdays during the winter the Center is open from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm. During the summer months the hours are from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm. Closed Sundays. A variety of programs are offered

including softball, basketball, volleyball, aerobics, dance, personal training, martial arts instruction, and weight room facilities. Passes can be purchased at the Rec Center Office. Call 563-0048

The Smithfield Blue Sox Baseball Team (semi-pro) play their home games at Forrester Acres. They have been an organization for 107 years and have won many Utah State Championships. Schedules of the games are available at the City office.

BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIREMENTS: Anyone operating a business within the city limits is required to obtain a business license. A business can be operated in either a commercial or residential zone depending on the location and type of business. Conditional use permits are required for some businesses with applications and information being available at the city office. Licenses expire December 31st of each year

and must be renewed before the **last business day of December** to avoid a late fee.
